Rinsed with no caps or lids. Labels are OK.
#1 Clear PET and #2 Colorless HDPE



PAPER

Newspapers and magazines loose in bin.
White office paper in purple bag, then in bin.



METAL

Rinsed. Labels are OK.



CARDBOARD - FLATTENED

Place larger boxes under/between bins, & smaller pieces in a bin or cardboard box of your own.



GARBAGE

When in doubt, throw it out!

GLASS

Rinsed with no caps or lids. Labels are OK.



Beer, wine, and liquor bottles
Food-grade jars and bottles



Pyrex, cooking/baking glass
Lightbulbs
Candle jars
Plates, bowls, mugs/cups
Windows
Mirrors
Lab glass
(e.g., beakers, flasks, etc.)
Broken glass
Glass with food residue/dirt
(e.g., a dirty peanut butter jar)



PLASTIC

Rinsed with no caps or lids. Labels are OK.
#1 Clear PET and #2 Colorless HDPE



#1 plastic (PET) screw-on bottles and jars
(e.g., water, soda, and juice bottles; mayo jars)
Clear cleaner bottles
(e.g., Windex, etc.)
Only some #2 plastics (HDPE), specifically colorless milk jugs

*Essentially, any clear or translucent screw-on bottle or jar made from #1 or #2 plastic



Plastic clamshells
(e.g., fruit or to/go containers)
#3 through #7 plastics
Plastic grocery bags
Plastic wrappers
Ziploc bags
Pill bottles
Opaque or colored #2 plastics
(e.g., shampoo/detergent bottles, white milk jugs)



PAPER

Newspapers and magazines loose in bin.
White office paper in purple bag, then in bin.



Newspapers & inserts
Magazines/catalogs



Plastic coated/glossy paper
Manilla folders
Construction paper
Non-white office paper
Junk mail
Receipts



White office paper
Envelopes (windows are ok)
Shredded office paper



METAL

Rinsed. Labels are OK.



Aluminum cans
Steel and tin cans



Bottle caps and lids
Paint, solvent, aerosol cans
Scrap metal, wires
Aluminum foil
Propane tanks
Wire hangers



CARDBOARD - FLATTENED

Place larger boxes under/between bins, & smaller pieces in a bin or cardboard box of your own.



Corrugated cardboard
(e.g., Amazon, moving boxes)



Any food-contaminated box
Plastic coated/glossy paper
Juice, milk, or soup stock cartons
Takeout pizza boxes



Paperboard
(e.g., cereal boxes)
Brown paper bags
Brown packing paper
Paper tubes



GARBAGE

When in doubt, throw it out!



Food wrappings, soiled/food-stained papers and containers
Tissues, tissue paper
Wax-coated papers
Gift wrapping paper and bows
Tubs, buckets, trays
Styrofoam
Paper towels
Coffee cups/lids
Motor oil containers
Diapers
Straws
Corks
Potato chip bags
